He worked for almost 10 years for Royal Dutch/Shell, among others as managing director of Shell Bulgaria, and he began his career as an analyst at McKinsey & Co.

Jules currently serves as chair of the [WEF Global Future Council on Net Zero Transition](#). He is a founding member of the global [Energy Transitions Commission](#). He also is a member of the New Energy advisory board of Shell, and a non-executive board member of the [Energy Web Foundation](#), and of [miq.org](#) a global methane certification program.
